A Regular Meeting of the Red Oak City Council was held via teleconference on Monday, February 8, 2021, at 7:00 p.m., with the following members present, to wit:

CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Stanfill called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., declared a quorum and announced that notices were legally posted pursuant to the Open Meetings Act and in accordance with an Order of the Office of the Governor issued on March 16, 2020, and as amended on April 2, 2020, the City Council for the City of Red Oak, Texas, will conduct the regular meeting by telephone conference to advance the public health goal of limiting face-to-face meetings (also called "social distancing") in an effort to slow the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19). This is an open meeting conducted partially by telephone conference, however, there will be no public access to the physical location.

All departmental reports were submitted to Council and addressed individually as needed. Mayor Stanfill asked the Directors to present anything significant if needed.

Fire Chief Blanton spoke announced that Nathan Diaz, the Red Oak Fire Marshal, is now treasurer for the North Texas Fire Investigators Association and gave some background on this organization. He then updated Council on the COVID-19 vaccine HUB for Ellis County and spoke about the new strains of COVID-19. Fire Chief Blanton also stated that he has two new firefighters joining the ROFR. He also warned about the frigid weather coming to the area next week.

Police Chief Wolf spoke and stated that members of his department have been participating at the Ellis County HUB with security and traffic control. He also stated that three new recruits will be going to the Academy on March 1st. Councilmember Braly commended the police and fire departments on their search for a missing child.

City Engineer Hartman spoke and let Council know that there is a vacancy on the Planning & Zoning Commission.

Human Resources Director Monsivais spoke and stated that she had no further updates, but recruitment has been going well.

Communications & Marketing Manager Beasley spoke and announced that the official City of Red Oak, Texas Facebook page will be going live tomorrow morning. It will serve as the city's main social media outlet for all city news, project announcements, road closure notices and information about events. It will highlight all of our city departments and services offered, local business and community events or initiatives that the city is participating in.

Finance Director Platt spoke and stated that Finance is working with fire and police to provide documentation on the requests for reimbursement regarding the COVID-19 Vaccine HUB expenses. We've not received the collection for the February sales tax yet, however, there was an increase of 24.09 percent increase in January over the previous period fiscal year. We are still collecting property taxes. Councilmember Braly asked a question about Rockett billing. Finance Director Platt answered his question.

IT Director Binford spoke and stated he's still setting up new computers and working on the Evergreen project. IT has also been setting up lots of new employees.

Library Director Ragsdale spoke and stated that he is proud of the library users and supporters coming out to support the Library. Mayor Stanfill thanked Mr. Ragsdale for letting him read to the children.

Parks and Recreation Director Kelley spoke and highlighted activities and projects given in his monthly report. He updated Council on the Hargrove Park construction. He also updated Council on the Live Oak Sports Complex.

Public Works Director Williams spoke and thanked Council for the crack sealing equipment they were able to purchase and use.


