CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Stanfill called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., declared a quorum and announced that notices were legally posted pursuant to the Open Meetings Act and in accordance with an Order of the Office of the Governor issued on March 16, 2020, and as amended on April 2, 2020, the City Council for the City of Red Oak, Texas, will conduct the regular meeting both in-person and via telephone conference to advance the public health goal of limiting face-to-face meetings (also called "social distancing") in an effort to slow the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19).

Monthly Operational Report

All departmental reports were submitted to Council and addressed individually as needed. Mayor Stanfill asked the Directors to present anything significant if needed.

Fire Chief Blanton spoke and stated that he currently has three firefighters that were deployed through the TIFMAS out to Amarillo and Electra for firefighting of about 2,500 acres of fires.

Police Chief Wolf spoke and stated that PD had a surprise audit from TCOLE (Texas Commission on Law Enforcement) and the department passed with no deficiencies which has been the case for the last three years. He attributed a large part of this outcome to his lieutenant. Chief then updated Council about the speeding issues on Post Oak Drive. A radar trailer was used as well as increased patrolling, however no significant speeding issues were discovered. He thanked Public Works Director Williams for working with his department in adding extra speed limit signage.

Communications & Marketing Manager Beasley spoke and stated that our new emergency notification system, CivicReady, is live and have already started the social marketing campaign encouraging residents to register for the platform.

City Engineer Hartman spoke and stated that the new restaurant, Tejun, is finally open. He also stated that Austin Boulevard is being paved right now and should be completed by Christmas. The Oaks development just moved equipment on site and will be getting started on construction. City Manager Fuller spoke and stated that in reference to the code enforcement complaints against the code enforcement officer, the employee is just working harder. He compared numbers of cases opened by a previous officer and percentage-wise, the numbers of complaints are not increasing, it's just that the officer is doing a lot more work. City Engineer Hartman also spoke to this issue adding additional information.

HR Director Monsivais spoke and updated Council on recruitment. The city added and processed four new hires in November. There are currently eight positions being actively recruited. Recruitment has slowed down for applicants as the holidays near but should pick up in the next couple of weeks.

Finance Director Platt spoke and stated the city is starting to receive its December sales tax collections and those are up 16.98 percent over the previous year for the same month. December collections also represent the first actual month of fiscal year 2022 revenue as the previous two months were accrued back into fiscal year 2021 because those are collected in arrears. The Finance Department has been getting quotes for a payment kiosk for utility billing allowing the department to expand its payment options for customers. The kiosk will be completely refundable from COVID grant funds. Finally, the department has gone out for bids for our local depository contract. The current contract expires in May of 2022.

IT Application Specialist Jenkins spoke and stated the city received its new NetMotion software and will get that installed by end of year. Also, several patches were installed on the email server, and it is now up-to-date and secure. The department got the public works application for the document management system running so they can begin digitizing their records. The department purchased 60 licenses of the new Microsoft Office 365 and has begun converting users over to that version.

Library Director Ragsdale spoke and stated that he was pleased to work with LS&S to work on an annual report for the last fiscal year. He believes it turned out well and hopes Mayor and Council have a chance to look at it. He added that Tuesday story time has been moved back inside just in time for the colder weather.

Parks and Recreation Director Kelley spoke and informed Council that Christmas in Red Oak event was a complete success. He thanked Police, Fire, Public Works, Library, Finance, Tourism and Marketing for their support and contributions to the event. There were over 35 entrants in the parade with over 1,000 people attending the event itself. He also updated Council on his department putting on movies in the park with the kick-off event last Thursday. There were 125 people. Director Kelley thanked Library Director Ragsdale and his library team for all their efforts supporting the event.

Public Works Director Williams spoke and updated Council on the retaining wall at Red Oak Road at Methodist Street stating that the blocks have been removed and work will begin on the repairs once the new blocks arrive. New conduit has been installed at the new municipal center at Live Oak and Oncor will come in and relocate the current electrical lines into the new conduit. Director Williams then updated Council on Stainback Road. After the roadway was paved, the city was made aware of some vehicles leaving the roadway damaging trees. His department has gone back and striped the roadway and put reflectors on each side of the stripe for additional safety markers
